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



CCCP SCHOLARS PROGRAM 2021-2022

Program Information & Goals

The goal of the program is to **motivate, inform and prepare** students to transfer from a California community college to selective **Top Tier Research** institutions such as UCLA. Students in the program have access to our **summer** and **year-long** academic preparatory transfer programs which guide students through the community college experience, **the application** and admissions process, research and pre-graduate opportunities, and career exploration. CCCP Scholars have a **higher rate** of admission to selective institutions and are eligible for **special scholarships**. The program is grounded on **academic excellence**, social justice, **critical race theory** and educational equity.

Program Requirements: *(Subject to change)*

1. One-year commitment starting summer 21 through spring 22.
2. Attend one of the required summer 21 activities.
3. Attend at least one CCCP sponsored activity each quarter.
4. Make at least one contact with a peer advisor each quarter.
5. Maintain enrollment at a California Community College.
6. Research and apply for at least one scholarship.
7. Maintain and update contact information: address, current community college, telephone and e-mail address.
8. Report academic and transfer progress each semester enrolled at a community college through UC TAP updates.
9. Complete a program entrance survey in the summer and a program exit survey at the end of the spring.
10. If admitted and enrolled at UCLA, engage with CCCP and campus partners in enhancing UCLA's transfer receptive culture.

NOTE: Not satisfying any of the requirements may terminate participation with the CCCP Scholars Program.

UCLA is on the quarter system as follows: Fall: Sept – Dec | Winter: Jan – March | Spring : March – June

Target Participants

CCCP targets students who can most benefit from a student-centered and social justice grounded program focusing on educational equity.

CCCP Scholars may :

- be the **first in their family** to go to college
- come from **low-income** backgrounds
- may be **non-traditional** students who have faced challenges in their academic career
- come from **underserved** communities
- have recently graduated from **high school** and plan to enroll in a community college in the fall OR students currently attending **community college** who have not yet completed a transfer curriculum at the time of application
- Be part of California's **higher education equity** plans

SEMILLAS RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

The SEMILLAS Research Team is seeking applicants for the **2021 Summer Research Fellowship Program (SRFP)**.

The SRFP is a **FREE 6-week virtual program** designed to introduce community college students to social science research. Fellows will learn about research that focuses on the experiences of historically marginalized students in higher education.

Fellows will participate in weekly research training sessions, engage in critical dialogue with leading Latina/o/x community college scholars, and connect one-on-one with a graduate student mentor/femtor. The program includes two primary components:

1. Research Training Sessions. Fellows will engage in once a week, interactive research sessions intended to help them become critical evaluators of educational research. Fellows will be introduced to foundational literature on Latina/o/x community college students; become familiar with theoretical foundations in higher education research; and learn about quantitative and qualitative research design.

2. One-on-One Mentor/Femtor Meetings. Fellows will be assigned individual graduate student mentors, including masters and doctoral students enrolled at SDSU, UCSD, UCLA, and other universities, who will provide guidance, support, and insights on conducting research.

BENEFITS OF PARTICIPATION

Fellows will receive:

- A research stipend of \$500 at the completion of the program's activities
- A graduate student mentor/femtor
- Mentorship from national Latina/o/x community college scholars

APPLICANTS:

- Must identify as Latina/o/x
- Must be currently enrolled as a community college student
- Must have completed at least 1 semester at their community college
- Must commit to the 6-week virtual program, which includes a minimum of 5 hours per week
- Must have an interest in social/behavioral sciences (sociology, education, criminal justice, social work, public health, etc.)
- Have an interest in transferring to a four-year college or university

Additional Meetings with Assigned Mentor TBD

COMMITMENT

- Minimum of 5 hours a week for 6 weeks
- Attend weekly seminar meetings

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
